Course Objective: Math 240 is the second semester of our calculus series, Math 140, Math 240, Math 250. Students coming to this course should have completed Math 140 or equivalent recently. One must know at least basic differentiation and integration rules from Math 140. Math 240 by far is more challenging than the other two calculus courses, Math 140 and Math 250. As such you should spend at least two hours for each our of class time. Key to success in this course is to come to class prepared and with questions ready for class discussion. At least half of each class period will be spent on problems discussion and problem solving.

This course is intended to achieve the following objectives

1. Gaining factual knowledge (terminology, classifications, methods, trends)
2. Learning fundamental principles, generalizations, or theories
3. Learning to apply course material (to improve thinking, problem solving, and decisions)
